(A word from your Pastor)

Dear PB Pres Family and Friends~

In mid-October, I was up in the East Bay Area for a pastors retreat and my 30-year high school reunion. The visit offered a fun chance to see my parents, and my mom and I decided on a Friday afternoon to drive through a neighboring town so that we could enjoy the Halloween decorations set out on front yards and porches. The pictures featured here were taken in front of the house that had our favorite set-up.







As you can see, in an imaginative way, the residents had conceived of a yard party featuring skeletons swinging on swings and competing in a variety of games, including wheelbarrow races, gunny-sack races, ladder ball, and corn hole. It was SO CREATIVE! And, it was a delightful contrast seeing dead things

brought to life amidst the other houses whose decorations seemed to threaten death for anything alive that got too close!

While I'm not ready to say that the house was a living example of how Jesus would decorate if he had a house at Halloween, I will say that the set-up reminded me of the wonderful ways God is able to restore, renew, and resurrect life. The Bible tells us the story of Creation, when God spoke and created life from the dirt. In fact, the name 'Adam' means 'earth, dust, or dirt' in Hebrew. Later, God invited the prophet Ezekiel to experience His power as the Lord restored a valley's collection of dry bone to life and formed them as a powerful army before Ezekiel's eyes (see Ezekiel 37). In Matthew 3, Jesus challenged the 1st Century Jews not to be too comfortable in their status as God's chosen people, as he reminded them that God's power was able to raise up a covenant people from the stones that lay on the ground in front of them.

Those stories build a sweet bridge in my faith between the themes of Halloween, All Saints Day, and Thanksgiving. As Jesus taught, there is greater rejoicing, greater thanksgiving in heaven, over one sinner who repents – who turns from dead ways to God's living ways – than over 99 righteous persons who need no repentance. And, let's face it, there's really no one who needs *no* repentance. So, as saints set free by God's free gift of grace, let's be playful and imaginative in the ways we point others toward the loving, life-giving salvation of God in Christ.

In this Thanksgiving season, I remain thankful to be your pastor and grateful for the life in Christ we share together in congregation. Blessings to you! ~Bill




Session Meeting Highlights

My favorite Fall activity is decorating my house. Bringing a little bit of Fall décor into the house gets the Fall vibes going, even if it is 75 degrees outside!


Amy Jones:
