Dear PB Pres Friends and Family~


July blessings to you! I hope the summer season has started well for each of you; and I hope the joy of the Lord is strengthening you, especially as the

June gloom is giving way to glorious San Diego summer sunshine.

In case you've ever wondered about my pastoral credentials, you should know that, on June 22nd, I walked on water. OK, actually, I rode on water. OK, even more accurate, I glided over the surface of the water. It's a little hard to explain, but it was awesome! For my 48th birthday in May, Molly scheduled a lesson for me to try e-foiling. If you're not familiar, e-foiling is riding a short surfboard attached to a hydrofoil that is powered by a remote-controlled propeller.

As the picture shows, e-foiling lets the rider surf about six inches above the surface of the water, where the flight is smooth, the sound is quiet, and the view is uniquely amazing. Other than trying barefoot waterskiing when I was in my teens (and nearly breaking most of what God gave me), e-foiling is about as close to walking on water as I expect to get, unless Jesus really surprises me someday.



My coach was a great Carlsbad native named Chuck. And, he taught me a challenging lesson

about following the leader. Because of the shape of the propeller and hydrofoil, each e-foil leaves behind it an underwater tunnel of air and water that makes it really difficult for other riders to follow closely behind. So, to ensure I got the best ride on my e-foil, Chuck told me to follow his *example* and follow his *advice* but not to follow *him*. When I forgot and tailed him, my watery road got bumpy, I lost the support I needed to keep moving forward, and I treated the Mission Bay onlookers to a few spectacular wipe-outs. But, when I remembered and obeyed my teacher's instructions, I enjoyed a much smoother, more successful ride, which made at least a few folks on the shoreline wonder how they could "walk on water," just like me.

This month, we're going to start a sermon series called "Community in Transition," focused on chapters 13-18 of the book of Exodus. It's the part of Israel's story tracking their movement from Egypt to Canaan, from slavery to freedom, and from being a despised people under Pharaoh to being a chosen and beloved people under God. Their experience of learning how to – and how not to – follow has a lot to teach us in our own transition from who we've been as a congregation to who God is shaping us to be. I'm excited to share that journey with you, and I hope you'll be able to participate fully, too, as we journey together through summer's activities and this new series, growing ever closer to God in Christ.

Dear PBPC Family,

I want to begin by thanking you for the love and support you have shown to the Roots ministry over many years. Your prayers, thoughts, financial gifts, and more have allowed us to serve Pacific Beach in a unique way over the past decade and more. But as times change, we recognize that Roots also needs to change in order to follow the work and will of God for our community. One way we are hoping to do this is by making it clear to everyone at PBPC that Roots is not just for young adults, but for everyone! While we do offer a service that looks markedly different from the one on Sunday morning, we hope that over time we can think of Roots as the evening service of PBPC, and not some entirely other thing that has little overlap with what happens on Sunday mornings.

In order to do this, we are going to do more integrating of the services over the coming months! Hopefully you will start to see some Roots musicians and leaders participating in the Sunday morning service occasionally, and vice versa. There will be greater alignment of the sermon topics and scriptures used at both services, and other elements may be borrowed as well. We hope that this will help both services feel like part of one unified church and bring greater joy and worship to both services!

This does not mean that our church will not have a ministry to young adults! Theology on Tap remains a popular gathering every week for mostly millennial-aged folks to gather in a comfortable setting to talk about God, and I hope to relaunch our young adult Bible study soon. Tony and I are also working on a new, Gen-Z focused ministry that we hope to launch in the fall.

So while the Roots service on Sunday night may not be a "young adult service" any more, our church will continue to have many options for younger people to engage with God, the Bible, and our church. It is my sincere hope that this restructuring will create many new opportunities for us to grow as a church in all sorts of ways. I hope and trust that you will keep Roots and all of our young adult ministries in your prayers over the coming months, and I encourage you to come see the work that God is doing on Sunday nights!

York City. (Anne has dual citizenship with the USA and Canada.) Anne attended Wooster College in Ohio where she learned to play organ on the school's magnificent instrument. Her first organ job began in 1967 at La Jolla Lutheran Church. Anne remembers that the time was the beginning of the Hippie "Jesus People" movement and the church didn't know what to do with all of the young people who didn't wear shoes and sat on the floor at the front of the church! 
Summer Music on the Courtyard


