(A message from your Pastor, Bill Sperry) Dear PB Pres Family and Friends~

"How long, Lord, must I call for help, but you do not listen? Or cry out to you, 'Violence!' but you do not save?" Habakkuk 1:2, New International Version

In the 7th Century BC, the prophet Habakkuk wrote, complained, and lamented over the visions God gave him of the suffering of God's people at the hands of the Babylonians. To correct their wayward ways, God was going to use a godless nation to punish a godly nation, and that didn't make sense to Habakkuk. And so, he spoke the words we all feel each time there is another act of senseless violence. "How long, Lord?"

Habakkuk didn't have the benefit of seeing God's salvation in Christ. We may not have the benefit during our lifetime of seeing how God redeems the horrific and tragic consequences of ongoing sin in our world, the sin that created the circumstances leading to the recent shootings in Buffalo and Orange County and Uvalde. But, with faith, we can trust and know that God redeems and saves. We have seen the evidence at the cross, through the empty tomb, and in the lives of billions of people transformed by God's loving and graceful Spirit. Though it may not always feel like God is listening to our calls for help, I believe the violence in our world grieves God even more than it grieves us. I believe God is always listening to us and always hoping that we will likewise listen to Him and to His prophets. Though the Lord does not always save people from tragic violence in this life, he was willing to endure tragic violence against his own flesh to show us the saving power of sacrificial love. And, I believe God continues to hope that we, the body of Christ for this generation, will also endure and sacrifice so that violence will be overcome by peace and brokenness will be healed by love.

Broken, violent, hurting, lonely people like Salvador Ramos, the Uvalde gunman, are in our world, in our communities. We have the challenge, the opportunity, and the privilege of being Christ in the flesh to them and to one another. It may take extra attention to see and hear them. It will take extra love and sacrifice to



embrace and walk with them. But, if we can make a difference that transforms and saves lives, it will be worth it. And, when we do God's will and speak God's truth in love, we have the strength of God on our side. Habakkuk knew that, and I believe it's why his opening words of complaint were completed with closing words of faith.

"... yet I will rejoice in the Lord, I will be joyful in God my Savior. The Sovereign Lord is my strength; he makes my feet like the feet of a deer, he enables me to tread on the heights." Habakkuk 3:18-19, New International Version

May the strength of God our Savior lead us in love so that mourning will turn to dancing and sorrow give way to joy.
