It is happening here in the US as well as in other countries. There will be some very unpleasant discussions and graphics (listener beware) as well as hopeful and positive discussions. The main issue is that God is ultimately in control. We win if we are on God's side. Childcare will be provided.

Ken Bailey Video Class October 14

Dr. Bailey continues his presentation of "Jesus Interprets His Own Cross" into two familiar parables, "The Lost Coin" and "The Two Lost Sons," commonly called "The Prodigal Son." These two parables were taught as a couplet, the first one out of the experiences of women and the other out of men's. Amazingly for that time, Jesus had women disciples who travelled with Him from village to village and provided the funds so He and the Disciples could eat. In The Two Lost Sons parable, this same costly love is illustrated by the father toward each son, one from the law-keeping mode of life and the other from the law-breaking mode. In each case, the father accepts the humiliation received from each son and offers a powerful demonstration of his love. A one-hour session will be held in Founders' Hall on Monday 10/14 at 2pm. Join us. No previously experience is necessary; we are all students.
