


Announcements

"Jesus Interprets His Own Person" May 4th and 9th

Dr. Kenneth Bailey concludes his comparison of Psalm 23 with Luke 15 in part 5 of this six-part video series as he looks at the person of Jesus and who He presents Himself to be. There is great evidence that the three parables told by Jesus in Luke 15 were created out of the 23rd Psalm. Dr. Bailey has condensed the similarities into seven points of comparison, ranging from the shepherd image to the "table prepared for me in the presence of my enemies." Jesus was saying to the Pharisees that he had come to find the lost sheep, those whom they had lost by not doing their duty, and yet they were complaining about Him. Jesus is saying in these parables that He is the presence of God among us. Dr. Bailey also makes the point that God acts in mercy "for His Name's sake" because He is who He is and can do no other, while we are the beneficiaries of His nature. Identical one-hour sessions will be held on Wednesday the 4th at 7:00pm and Monday the 9th at 2:00pm in Founders' Hall. Everyone is most welcome.
