A FRIENDLY REMINDER

This is a reminder to those members and friends of PBPC who have pledged their support to the Church in 2017 to pay a one-time fee of \$33.71 per member which is called the "per capita apportionment" and is indicated by the blue envelope in the pledge box you received or was sent to those who pay their pledges on-line. The amount (\$33.71 per member) is charged to our church based on the membership of PBPC and is used to pay a share of the expenses of the presbytery, the synod and the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in the United States. Please place the envelope with your payment in the offering plate during worship service or send them to the office. The Session thanks you for your continued support for our worldwide missions and ministry to our community.

We would like to let everyone know about the contents of the offering envelope boxes. In addition to the weekly white tithe envelope, each box contains:

- Initial Offering Envelope (yellow) is a contribution to the printing and processing of offering envelopes. It helps the church offset this cost. You can contribute any amount.
- Per Capita Apportionment (blue) is the amount of money per member of the church that we send to the Presbytery to use in their mission work. It is \$33.71 per person this year.
- Milestones (pink) is a donation to our endowment program. The endowment is an investment account for the church to assist in our financial needs. You may contribute any amount and it will go into our investment portfolio. This portfolio is professionally managed and the amounts invested remain secure.
- Deacon's Fund (white/gold) is a monthly envelope that designates funds to the Deacons of the church to use in their mission work here in PB and San Diego. You may donate any amount.

"Jesus and His Vision of Mission"

Dr. Ken Bailey continues this video series by turning to the book of Luke to see how Jesus "edited" the words of Isaiah's prophecies into a dense diamond that reflects His own understanding of Himself and His ministry. Luke 4:16-30 is one of the most dense passages in the new Testament in terms of its understanding and answer to the Christian disciple's question, "Oh, Lord, what shall I do?" As Jesus stood up in the Temple and quoted Isaiah, He left out some phrases that the people had equated with their identity and their return from exile. They had understood that Isaiah 61 was speaking vengeance against the nations who would become subjects of the Jewish people. But Jesus was disagreeing with their politics which they had mixed with their religion. A one-hour session will be held on Tuesday the 14th at 12:00 noon in Founders' Hall. This 30-minute DVD of Dr. Bailey's insights will help us better understand God's acts to save all people through His love and His holiness.
