“Jesus and His Vision of Mission” — June 13th

The Bailey video tape series continues with a discussion of “The Centrifugal and Centripetal Forces of Mission.” Dr. Bailey focuses on a cluster of three parables from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount which speak of salt and light. Eight contrasts and six comparisons are given between salt and light which unpack the theological content of these metaphors of Jesus and help us to understand the mission that God has set before us. Salt works invisibly and light works visibly. Some of our mission efforts are not obvious while others are. Light works at a distance while salt functions only when in contact. So, also, some of our missions are powered from a distance and others in close personal contact. We are told that we are the salt of the earth and the light of the world. We as Christians are to be salt to those around us, adding taste, purification, and preservation in their lives. We are also to be light to the world, bringing vision and hope where darkness abides. **A one-hour session will be held on Tuesday the 13th at 12 noon in Founders' Hall.** Newcomers are always welcome.
