## Planning Ahead

### **Ken Bailey Video Series — Tuesday, January 8th at Noon**

This month Dr. Bailey focuses on Jesus' parable "The Pharisee and the Tax Collector" as found in Luke. Both a Pharisee and a tax collector went to the Temple to join the traditional daily atonement sacrifice and each found a place to pray. The Pharisee prayed by himself, neither confessing his sins nor asking forgiveness. He boldly boasted about his status and religious works. Meanwhile, the tax collector stood far off and looked downward while he beat his chest (a humbling gesture done only by women in that culture), but only asked God for mercy. Jesus said that the arrogant Pharisee was not accepted before God, while the one who begged for forgiveness was accepted in God's presence. Neither man realized that Christ, the Lamb of God, would become the sacrifice for the sins of them both. This one-hour session will be held on Tues., 1/8 at noon in Founders' Hall. Come and enjoy this look at Jesus' parable from a Middle Eastern perspective.
