After a lot of conversation, deliberation and prayer, we made the difficult decision to not offer our mid-week elementary Kingdom Kids program this Fall.

At the same time that we realized that door was closing, we recognized that another door was opening. So, we are shifting our focus to a more personal, relationship-building model and we are starting with the Preschool parents, children and teachers.

Twice a month, we will be serving coffee and donuts during morning drop off time. We already kicked this off on the first day of the new school year and we are excited about the opportunity it created to begin conversations and get to know the parents – and them us.

At the end of September, we will host a dinner that will be open to all of the Preschool families. They will be able to come and enjoy a free meal for their family, conversation with other preschool parents and fun games for their children. This will also be an opportunity for us to connect in a deeper way with the parents and children. If this is received well, we will do the dinner on a monthly basis.

We will continue the weekly Chapels with the Preschool children, blessing the Preschool staff with small gifts on a quarterly basis and host fun events throughout the year, starting with the Trunk or Treat event on Monday, October 30.

The quote above from Alexander Graham Bell is not complete. It is said that the full quote goes like this, "When one door closes another door opens; but we often look so long and so regretfully upon the closed door that we do not see the one which has opened for us."

We know that shutting the door and saying goodbye to a long-standing, cherished program can be hard, but we are excited about the many opportunities we will have to say "Hello," and are choosing to keep our eyes open to see all the new doors that get opened.

The Deacons continue to request donations from the congregation for CCSA through the month of September





UPDATE FROM THE TREASURER

Our income and expenses through July 2023 have both been better than we had planned with higher income and lower expenses in total as shown below. However, per our budget in faith in God's good provisions we will be spending over our income and on a cumulative basis our net income is (\$72,450) through July. This is a smaller deficit than we had planned for this time in the year by over \$15,706. Per our budget we have been withdrawing \$14,000 per month from our LPL Financial reserves (see below) to manage our cashflow. It is worth noting that our first half expenses have included important improvements to our church campus for security purposes. Hopefully, you have noticed the new windows and doors on the office and education buildings. These improvements are costing us about \$75,000 but we will be receiving a check for this amount from the security grant that we were awarded last year. In order to cover the costs for these expenses we have withdrawn an additional \$40,000 from LPL Financial. So as of the end of July, we have made the payments but have not received the reimbursement and we will get a large credit to help us for the 2nd half of the year. In addition, we also applied for an ERTC (Employee Retention Tax Credit) and expect to receive approximately \$223,000.00 in the next few months. God's blessings are abundant! Big shout out to Pat Hom, Stacey Kaye, Chris Woodruff, and B&G for completing the applications and executing the Security Grant and the ERTC.
