After my sabbatical, my life is a blank slate – I do not know where I will be or what I will do, but I trust that God will reveal those answers in time.

It's not an easy thing I am challenging you to do. But there are no quick fixes or easy answers. There is no magic program or worship song or sermon series that can miraculously bring a host of young families to PBPC. But perhaps, if we recommit to putting all our energy into living like Jesus, following his example of love and grace, PBPC might yet become the kind of community that anyone and everyone would want to be a part of.

#### FROM THE PASTOR


