Many of y'all know that our students left for winter camp this past President's Day weekend, and I am glad to report that we had an INCREDIBLE time at Pine Valley Bible Camp together! I'll let the pictures do the talking in a moment, but let me just say: This church came through for our students this winter. That's frequently true, but it was especially true this time around.

Despite a bake sale that beat our previous fundraising record (at least in the last 12 years), many of our families needed a little bit of extra help to afford camp. Season to season, camp to camp, PBPC has always made a promise that no student would be prevented from attending camp and experiencing this valuable ministry for financial reasons. This winter camp, that same promise was made, and kept! Thanks to PBPC, over half of our attending students were able to have their camp partially or completely covered - allowing them to attend when they otherwise couldn't. Again, this isn't counting the \$60 per student that we were able to knock off thanks to the bake sale!

The theme of our camp this season was "Transformed by God." Thanks to your stewardship, students who've never set foot into a church learned that God loves them as they are; no matter what. Students learned that our God is faithful to help shape them into the people they are meant to be - even when change feels impossible. Lastly, our students learned what christlikeness really looks like, and how we can learn to love ourselves when we love God.

These are powerful lessons. When you couple them with three days of friendship, games, and a youth minister who lets you stay up waaaaaay too late... they become life changing. I am so incredibly grateful to God for the blessing he provided our thirteen students, and three leaders, and I am also incredibly grateful to be a part of a church who made it possible for each and every student to participate - regardless of their context. Dear friends,

This first month of 2024 has had me still giddy and hopeful from the nearly two weeks full of events in December. From hosting two different cookie making and decorating parties with kids and families (one of them over 50 people came!), meeting even more family members of local friends, and finally grasping enough language to get both of my daughters to the dentist for some needed dental work the final days of 2023 were exhausting but satisfying.

I have some pictures of the cookie making parties that occurred the Thursday and Saturday before Christmas but none that capture the whole scene - people of different faiths fellowshipping together. Foreigners and locals enjoying an expat tradition of cutting out and decorating cookies (although most Tajik women are skilled at handling dough). Meeting family members of local friends we've never met. Running out of the two huge degs (pots) of Osh and Kebab we had prepared.

I had a moment of horror when I realized we had run out of food only to see Malika's^{*} (our house helper) eyes sparkling as she proudly announced, "We ran out of food!" For the entire week after she would talk about how fun these events were, emphasizing HAPPILY that we ran out of food...sharing with others how Isaac and an expat friend of his were in the kitchen helping to prepare the food (many men will work in restaurants professionally but avoid being seen working in the kitchen at home)...hearing back from her family members kids that they liken our home to the movie "Home Alone" (we're still trying to sort this one out but think it's a good thing).

And this probably sums up how I've learned to reframe and understand many of my experiences from this past year living in Tajikistan. What feels chaotic and sometimes disconnected and frequently overwhelming to me is typically born out of my own faulty belief that I must be organized and in control and involved for things to go well or be well. When, actually, God, who is the author of all things life, continues to keenly and creatively and lovingly weave a beautiful tapestry of interactions and experiences.

And it is with this trust that we enter 2024. My own heartfelt desire is to sit at as many дастерхон/ tables with as many women as possible. To listen deeply as they share their triumphs and struggles. To see and take opportunities to speak life and truth into their lives. To know deeper myself truly what is the height and width and breath of God's love in my own life. To live in the freedom in Christ that trusts that His yoke is easy and His burden is light.

For 2024 we are praying about work opportunities as we will still use much of this year to deepen our Tajik language studies (this is also in accordance with our Student Visa status). Isaac is exploring a new conversation partner and I am taking lessons out into the city and starting to read and understand one of the two translations of the Good Book that are in Tajik.

Isaac is also exploring creative business ideas and partnerships, as well as there are plans that he will begin a formal role as P@stor with the International Ch_rch of Dushanbe. We both are considering opportunities to teach English and we both are volunteering many hours at the kids' school.

And how are the kids?

Evie is proving that she is ready to take some piano lessons. It is so fun to hear her pick out melodies on the piano and she expresses so much a desire to learn. We also just finished the first half of the school year and I love hearing about how she demonstrates both leadership and followership in her classroom.

Isaiah's reading is growing in leaps and bounds! His teacher thought to challenge him a bit and it has been amazing to see him grow so quickly in this area. One of his favorite dinner table games is a free form Mad Lib style game where one person thinks of a noun and another person constructs a sentence without knowing what the noun is. Shrieks of laughter are inevitable!

Alexis loves playing with Malika's^{*} 6 year old daughter on days when she comes to clean. She is also a favorite with the secondary kids volleyball team as she loves to go with Isaac on the days he coaches. We may have just learned about an opportunity to do a local gymnastics class and she is begging to be a part of it.

Nemo's speech grows every day, both in English and Tajik, and he loves to sing both the worship songs he has heard on Sunday mornings and other child favorites such as "Happy Birthday" and "Old MacDonald Had a Farm". Despite his frequent and scary struggles with respiratory viruses(prayers coveted!) his love for cars and dinosaurs and climbing things continues.

And I can't end this update without acknowledging... CARE PACKAGES! What a way to send a true HUG 5000 miles away! We have been so blessed and blown away by the thoughtfulness and effort it takes to fill and send these and it is such a fun and unique opportunity to share a few of our familiar treats with our local friends and to be able to gift their tables with American candies, just something a little unique (Hershey kisses were a big hit, although, are quite funny to describe the name ().

And I can't end a "Welcome to 2024" newsletter without extending a heartfelt THANK YOU to those of you on our prayer and financial support team that allow us the opportunity to live and serve here. • God has been here far longer than us and it is an honor to have a front row seat to the work he is doing here. From the bottom of our hearts, THANK YOU!

As we look ahead to 2024 there are work opportunities locally but they will not impact our overall budget much. For example, when Isaac begins his part time work as the pastor of IC-D he will likely earn \$147/month. For this reason we are thankful for our ongoing givers and we are seeking new financial partners to add to our team! If you or anyone you know would like to learn more about our life and work here in Taj we would love to set up a Zoom or phone call.

ENDOWMENT FUND UPDATE

Our church is blessed to have an Endowment Fund that was established by the gifts of members since 1991 to use in service to God through the missions of Pacific Beach Presbyterian. The Endowment Fund is unique in that the original donated principal is maintained for perpetuity with only proceeds from the investments being used each year for missional activity. Since 1991 over \$415,000 has been donated to this fund. The fund is currently managed by Paul Celentano of Objective Wealth Management using LPL Financial Services.

In 2023 the Endowment Fund contributed \$10,000.00 to the church; and received \$70 in new contributions. The overall fund did well in 2023 and you can see the details below.
